Council meetings are also broadcast live on Channel 3, Facebook Live, and streamed online.

The Special Meeting of the City Council was held Monday,
December 21, 2020
and was held virtually.
E-comments and emailed comments were accepted and read.

A Special Meeting of the City Council was held on December 21st with Regular Session beginning at 6:30pm and Closed session beginning at 7:47pm and concluded at approximately 8:35pm.

City Council Member Silva gave the invocation. Mayor Pro Tem Dunlap led the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was one report out from the City Attorney on Closed Session items. On a vote of 4-1 (Zahra opposed), the City Council approved the authorization of execution of a tolling agreement with the City of Buena Park regarding the legal acts regarding Ordinance No. 3289 and that the tolling agreement will be effective through March 1, 2021.



There were no presentations made.

A few e-comments were submitted regarding City issues, such as Covid mandates, e-comments process, and virtual hosting of future City Council Meetings.

Regular Business Items:

- Item #1: Authorization To File Amicus Brief In Support of Sheriff Barnes / County Of Orange In Case No. 30-2020-1141117 Involving Inmate Release Due To Covid. The item was discussed and moved to table the item. On a 3-2 vote (Whitaker, Dunlap opposed) the item was tabled. Tabling is a procedural move to remove it from consideration until one of the affirmative votes asks for the item to be reconsidered.
- Item #2: Authorization To Obtain Replacement Insurance Coverage. The City recently was canceled for one of its layers of insurance coverage. The City self insures up to \$2 million and pays for additional insurance layers above this amount. This item was discussed and passed unanimously with direction to continue to review our insurance options.
- Item #3: Notice To California Public Employees Retirement System (CALPERS) Reserving The Right To Exclude Certain Future Groups From Membership Of The System. This item was discussed again after having been heard originally on December 15th. After discussions and questions to the City Manager, it was moved and on a vote of 2-3 (Zahra, Jung, Silva opposed), the item failed.



The January 5, 2021 City Council Meeting is cancelled by City Council Resolution.
